# The K-centres landscape – is anything important missing?

## Languages:

- For some languages we have a portal where people can get information about a broad spectrum of computational and other aspects of the language – but not for all. Is that a problem or will the National Consortia take on this role?
- Almost all CLARIN languages are worked on by some K-centre, but with uneven coverage across topics.
- No K-centres for some of the European minority languages, classical languages, or some important languages from outside Europe.

## Modalities:

- There seem to be no modalities missing, which does not necessarily mean that we can offer access to all modalities for all languages.

## Linguistic topics:

- Coverage is rather complete, but some topics are still missing, e.g. neurolinguistics, psycholinguistics.

## Language processing topics:

- Coverage is rather complete. Some missing topics: language understanding, generation, summarization, word sense disambiguation.

## Data types:

- Coverage seems rather complete.

## Families of resources:

- One third of the CLARIN families is not covered by a K-centre at all or only covered for a subset of the languages.

## Generic issues:

- Good coverage but working with standards is missing. It would be good for CLARIN to have a K-centre for standards.
- It would also be good to think about having K-centres that cut across domains, such as language and GIS.

- Do you have suggestions for topics for which we should try to encourage sites to create a K-centre?
- Do you see candidate sites that we could approach and stimulate?
- Do you see missing topics that you could easily take on board in your own K-centre?
