



Saturday October 27 Knowledge Sharing Infrastructure (KSI)

We can look at the CLARIN Agreement for the basis of the KSI possibilities in the member countries. We need to have more specific questions in the Agreement on the KSI.

We can share successful dissemination activities (not reinventing the wheel) into a pool of expertise. Some centres already offer services, which they are happy to share. They would like to participate in the KSI committee (to be established).

Bring under the attention of the funding agencies: we not only need funding for the technical infrastructure, but also for the knowledge infrastructure.

Let yourself be invited as a keynote speaker for a conference of SSH scholars; think of writing cross-disciplinary papers, because in the end it is all about scientific outcome.

A bottom approach can work fine (case of Austria): first low profile, but now they are seen as the gatekeepers. Cross disciplinary work is indeed very useful. And also focusing on new research projects

We can create an annual award for the best cross-disciplinary paper.

Form a working group on user involvement. Starting point in user involvement should be the dataset of the user: what do they have and what do they want with it.

Find the young people in the (national) humanities associations.

There are some examples of use cases in the CLARIN preparatory phase, and CLARIN NL also has examples. They should not be too complex and show the user that they can do better research. Show them the added value ("on the shoulder of the giant").

App store approach: simple tools, not shiny applications, and then let the researchers get used to these solutions. Make a good user interface.

There is already some experience in training users in tools (CLARIN D).

Exploit the 2-level structure: the national projects should reach out to the users in their own country.
