The transcription chain offers...

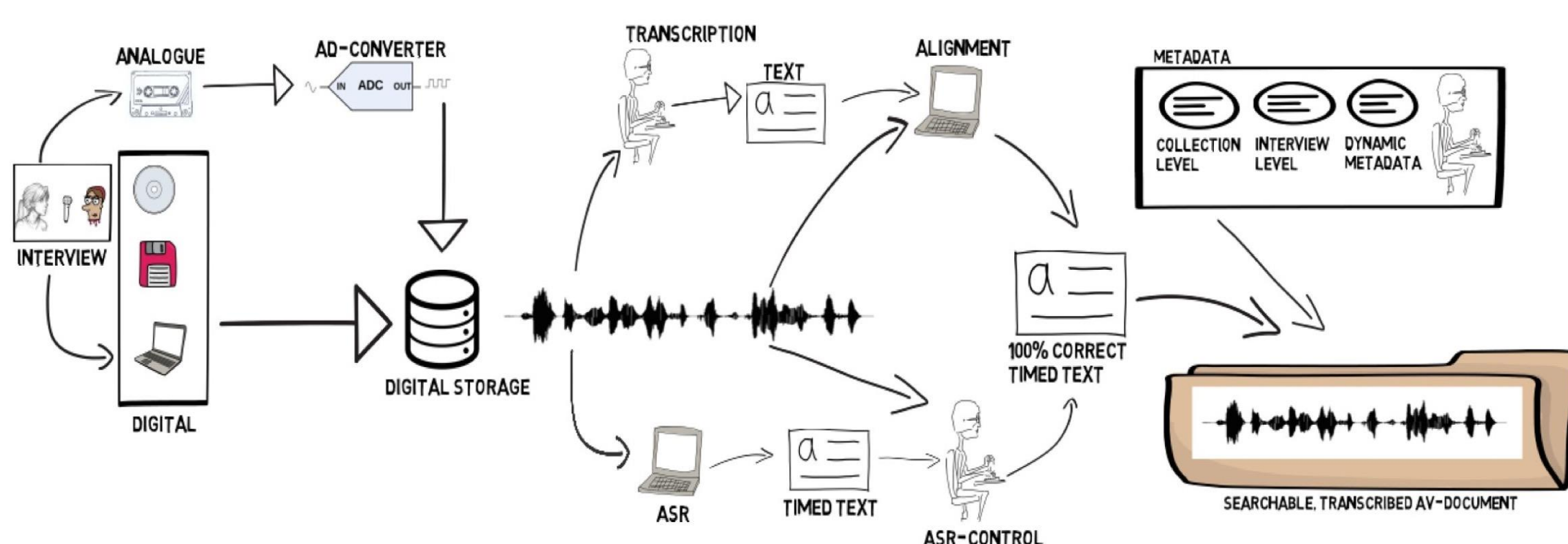
- (semi-)automatic transcription support for oral history recordings

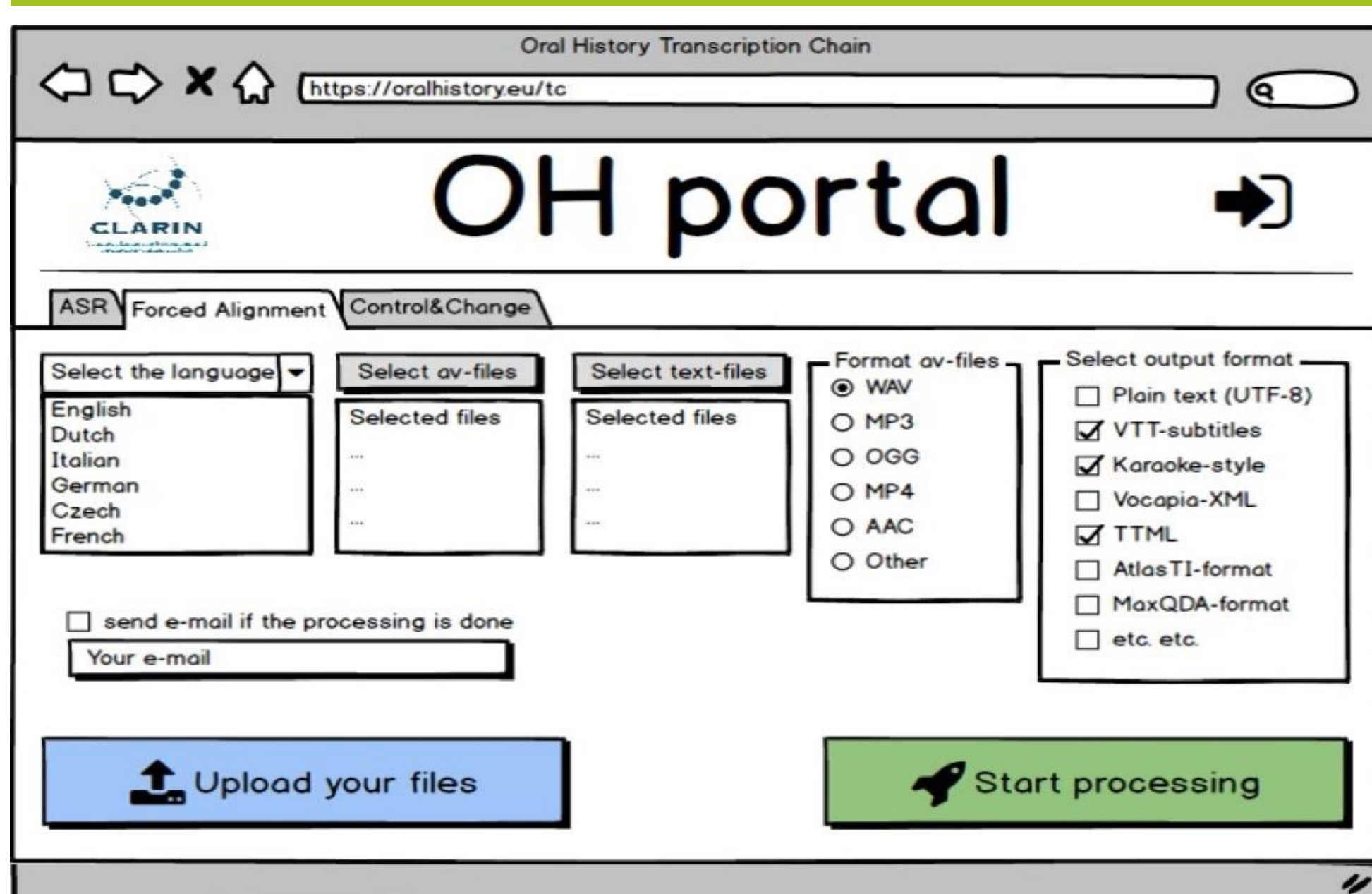

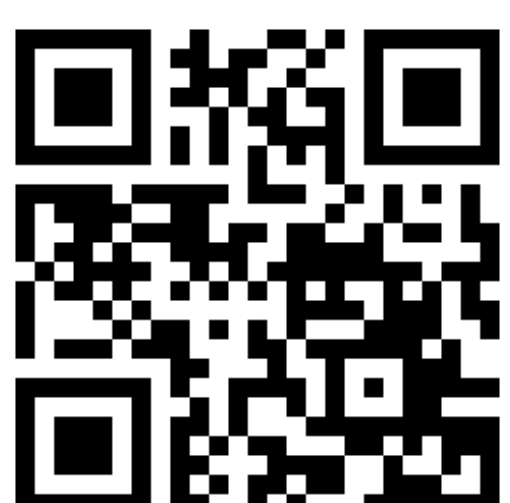


The challenges are...

- human transcription is time-consuming
- automatic speech recognition does not perform well in real-life conditions
- lack of models for non-standard speech (dialect, old speakers, special topics)
- building dedicated acoustic models
- having to deal with a large number of data and file formats
- divergent requirements by oral historians, linguists, phoneticians, technology developers...

- Development of the OH Transcription Portal (to be ready by Dec. 2017)
- Follow-up workshop about using the transcriptions in qualitative and quantitative OH research (2018)
