Uptake by researchers

Achievements in 2019 (highlights)

- **CLARIN Resource Families**: again a salient thread in the outreach to new communities. It has inspired work on requirements and on the visibility of data sets, standards and tools
- SCAN WEST CONTROL OF THE PROPERTY OF THE PROPE
- New programme launched to get access to researcher communities without a strong CLARIN history: CLARIN Ambassadorship
- Tour de CLARIN: now a flagship activity for promoting the national consortia, their resources, tools, events and researchers within and outside the CLARIN network. Will soon also include K-centres.
- Several awareness raising efforts and a (co)financing instrument for UI events in place and at least one UI event has been organised in most of the CLARIN countries, and over 7500 participants were counted
- Training materials on how to generate innovative research questions and methods have been developed.

Achievements in 2019 (highlights)

Centres, data, services

- Regular centre assessments
 As planned, 2 assessment rounds were organised. Out of 57 registered CLARIN centres, 21 have been certified as B-centre (1 new, 9 recertifications)
- Access to persistent identifier services
 Next to its EPIC membership, CLARIN ERIC also became DataCite member, which ensures both technical and policy-wise access to the DOI ecosystem.
- Closer integration of data and tools
 More tools were connected to the Language Resource Switchboard Robustness checks (especially with regards to file size) were done based on datasets from Europeana
- Development of the infrastructural services: VLO, FCS, VCR, LRS

Extension of the ERIC

- PARTHENOS, a thematic cluster around European RIs in the humanities
- DSI -4 Collaboration with Europeana
- EOSC-hub, a pilot in the European Open Science Cloud, that started in January 2018.
- ERIC Forum, collaboration with the other ERICs
- SHHOC, towards a Social Sciences and Humanities Open Cloud; till April 2022. The CLARIN contribution to SSHOC will be realised by the central organisation and six CLARIN nodes. Room for focus on migration studies, requirements for qualitative data analysis, support for processing interviews and heterogeneous data)

- ENRIITC (kick-off in January 2020)


